






Connect to Wi-Fi

You can connect to a wireless network (commonly known as Wi-Fi networks) to access the Internet. Check if there are Wi-Fi networks near your location by clicking the network icon in the lower-right corner of your screen. Just click a network name to connect to it.

Enable Wi-Fi usage and connect

1. Click the network icon  in the lower-right corner of your screen.
2. Select your network status from the menu that appears.
3. Make sure Wi-Fi usage is enabled, which will allow your Chrome device to detect nearby networks. In the menu that appears, click . If you see , that means Wi-Fi is already enabled.
4. Detected networks automatically show up in the menu. To connect to a network, simply select its name.

When you see the  icon in the lower-right corner of your screen, that means your device is connected to the network.

Note: Secure networks are marked with the  icon and require additional information before you can connect. If you're connecting to a secure network that uses password authentication, you'll be prompted to enter a password. Choose "WPA" to use WPA or WPA2-Personal security.
